Everybody at Lostock Hall is encouraged to follow the 'golden rules'. Points are awarded by all adults to children who are following these rules. Points are collated and children are then awarded badges at our weekly Friday 'Celebration' assembly. 100 points for Bronze, 200 for Silver and 300 points for Gold badges respectively. Each badge is returned to school when a new badge is received. Children who achieve 400 points or more are able to keep their Gold badge. All the children are also part of a House Team- Kestrel, Merlin, Osprey and Goshawk. Weekly points earned by the children are also carried forward to their house for recognition as part of the Friday Assembly.

A separate 'Heart of Gold' award is nominated by the children, again, to any child who has stood out following all the golden rules. Only one child will receive this special award and will retain the badge until the following Friday, when it will be awarded to the new recipient.
